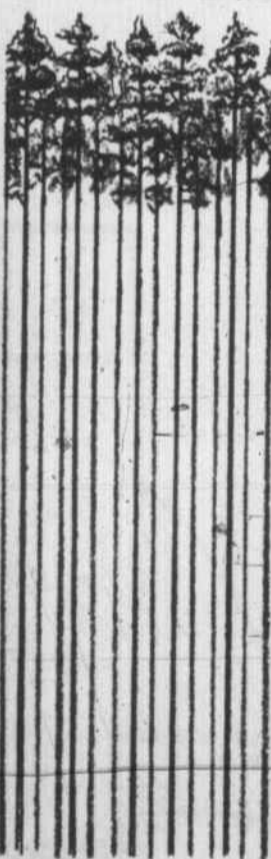
Auditions For Musical To Be Held
