Mrs. I. D. Moon, president, presided and extended a most cordial welcome to the members and their guests.

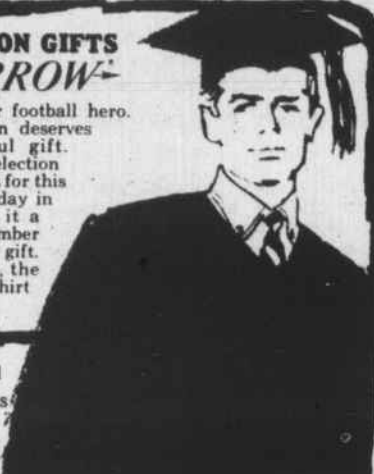
The head dining table was centered with an arrangement of assorted spring flowers. On the smaller tables vases of red and yellow roses were used.

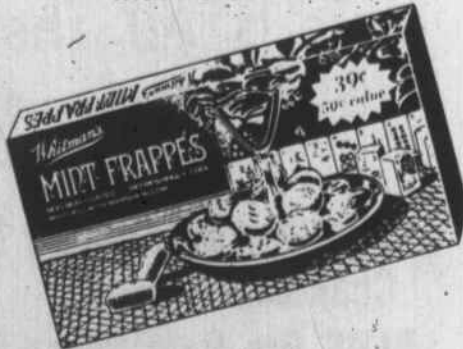
