Winston of Youngsville, will be in Strasbourg, France this summer with the Travel Study International, Summer School and Travel Seminar. Miss Winston, several other Louisburg College students, and their French teacher Mrs. Parke Brown, will join students and teachers from over the United States to leave by plane from New York July thirteenth and return by boat on the S. S. Ryndam, arriving home August twenty-ninth.

Travel Study International (TSI) is an American institution expressly created to complement the American education system through national and international academic summer programs, designed to stimulate the intellectual curiosity of students.

The unique advantage of TSI's Strasbourg campus is its location on the threshold of France and Germany. Built on the banks of the Rhine, it is called the "Gateway to Europe".

Students will live on campus, attend morning classes in French language and Civilization, spend afternoons for local travel, and participate in weekend excursions covering areas of France and Germany. The schedule is highlighted with trips to Heidelberg, Mayence, The Black Forrest, and Luxemburg. At completion of summer school, students are to visit Paris and London before returning home.

Mrs. Davis is the widow of the Reverend R. W. Davis, a former retired teacher, principal and pastor of the Warren Baptist Church, Warren, North Carolina, and the mother of two sons one of whom is Mr. R. Wilbur Davis, a Long Island Terminal Mail dispatcher, United States Post Office, Long Island City, New York, who is a World War II Veteran. Mr. Arnold B. Davis, the other son, is a stockholder and professional video tape craftsmen with Technetics International, Inc., New York City. While in the service of his country Arnold was chief Television Engineer, Armed Forces Radio and Television System, Viet Nam. For services rendered while serving as advisor to the Vietnamese Government on Television he received a citation from the Vietnamese Government.
