Greensboro - Miss Alice Adelaide Green of Franklin was among the 170 sophomore scholars honored at a special reception on campus Tuesday at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Miss Green is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. S. J. Green of 209 Lee St. in Franklin. Purpose of the reception was to acknowledge outstanding scholarship by the students and to give them an opportunity to talk informally with various faculty members about areas of study in which they have an interest.

The 170 sophomore scholars were selected on the basis of scholarship achievement from a sophomore class at UNC-G totaling 1,333 students. Altogether, UNC-G has more than 6,400 students this year.

Mrs. Tommie Lou Smith, associate dean at UNC-G, was coordinator for the reception. UNC-G Chancellor James S. Ferguson and Miss Mereb Mossman, vice chancellor for academic affairs, extended greetings to the group.

Various deans, department heads, advisors for the junior year abroad program, the chairman of the International Studies Program and the chairman of the UNC-G Honors Council also attended the reception.
