About Your Home

Even if your house is built strongly and solidly, of frame or masonry, it will still need insulation to keep the heat in during the winter and the heat out during the summer.

There are many materials on the market today that do a good insulating job. Any of them can be used in new houses. In old houses, it is usually possible to use a loose fill insulation or insulating batts or an insulating board which is a wall and ceiling finish.

A vapor barrier and adequate ventilation are important in maintaining the insulation's efficiency. The barrier will prevent passage of moisture through the wall. Proper ventilation carries off any moisture that may be in the construction. An asphalt or some other coated paper, or metal foil, will serve as a vapor barrier. Many insulating materials are manufactured with vapor barriers built in. These should be installed so the barrier faces the inside of the house.

For satisfactory results, insulating must be correctly installed and be complete. Insulating only the roof or attic floor will save fuel, but side-wall insulation, weather-stripping and storm windows and doors are necessary for real comfort and fuel savings.

There are endless types of good insulating materials—even an insulating concrete of vermiculite and cement mixture.

- Makes 12 muffins
2 cups pancake mix

1 cup milk
2 tablespoons melted or liquid shortening
1 teaspoon grated orange peel
2 tablespoons orange marmalade

Heat oven to hot (425° F.). Combine pancake mix and sugar in bowl. Stir in peanuts. Add egg, milk, shortening and orange peel, stirring only until combined. Fill greased muffin cups 3/4 full. Place 1/2 teaspoon orange marmalade in center of each muffin. Bake in preheated oven (425° F.) 15 to 20 minutes.

By Appointment

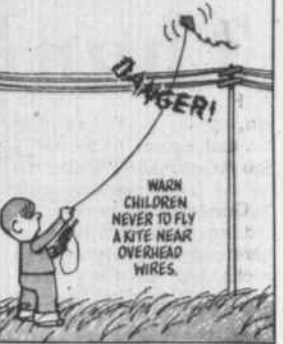
