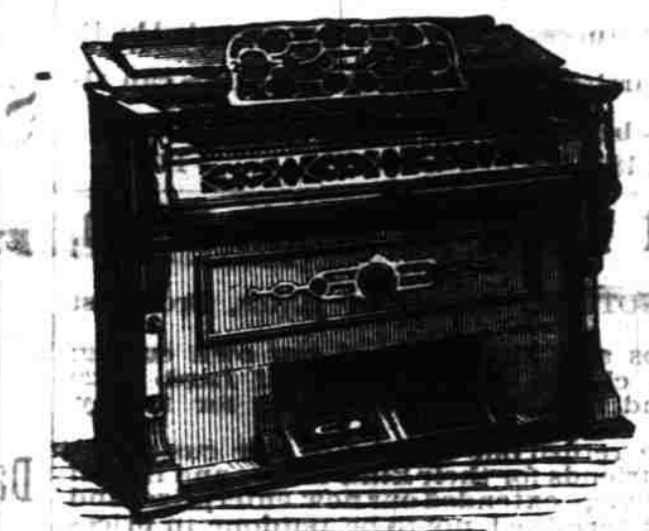

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA.

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.
WHEREAS, Official information has been received at this Department that FRANK MALPASS, late of the county of New Hanover, stands charged with the murder of Edward S. Walker, of said county; and that the said Malpass has fled the State, or so conceals himself that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him:
Now, therefore, I, TOD R. CALDWELL, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of authority in me vested by law, do issue this my Proclamation offering a reward of THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS for the arrest and delivery of the said Frank Malpass to the Sheriff of New Hanover County, in the City of Wilmington, and I enjoin all officers of the law and all good citizens of the State to aid in bringing said criminal to justice.
Done at our City of Raleigh, on the 23d day of September, A. D. 1873, and 1. s. in the ninety-eighth year of American Independence.

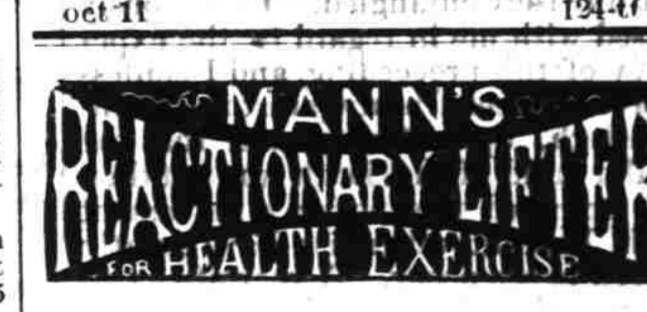
