We regret to hear of the death of Mr. Hugh Reynolds of Salisbury. We have known Mr. Reynolds well. He was justly held in high esteem by his acquaintances, for he was just and liberal in all the relations of life, but incorruptible and fearless in duty. A good man has fallen.

The wind and fall storm which struck this place Tuesday night between 10 and 11 o'clock, was very severe along the coast all the way from below Florida to Baltimore and Washington. It caused much damage as has been done to shipping. The telegraph lines were everywhere prostrated and communication broken. At Washington houses were unmanned and trees torn up; and considerable damage to wharves and shipping.

SENTENCED TO BE HANGED.

On the night of the 19th inst. James Alphonso Davis, a native of Chapel Hill, and formerly a clerk at the Bayden House in this place and afterwards by some of our citizens as a "fast" young man, in company with one Henry Andrews, white, and two negroes, committed a burglary by forcibly entering the residence of Mrs. M. L. Hendon, a lady resident of Chapel Hill.

The intent it seems, was to rob the house, but the lady had been warned of the alarm and she was not so easily deceived. The burglars were captured and sentenced to be hanged on the 22d of November next.

TILDEN AND THE TELEGRAMS.

He Publishes His Expected Card, Denying All Allegations of Complicity in the Matter.

New York, Oct. 17.—Mr. Tilden publishes a card in which, referring to the recent cipher telegrams, he says he has no knowledge of the existence of these telegrams, and no information about them, except what has been derived from or since their publication. Referring to the alleged attack on the electoral votes of Florida and South Carolina, he says he has no knowledge of the existence or purport of any telegrams relating to the subject. He says as evidence that his position on his part, looking to a bargain of any kind, would have been inconsistent with his plain duty, which he could have carried out unless he was untrammelled by any commitment in the choice of men to execute the official trust of the government and free from any obligations to particular interests. "I was resolved," he says, "in full command of my resources, or not at all."

The telegraph operator, of Salisbury, N. C., during the time it is said the telegrams were sent, says they were not sent to that office.

It will be information to many persons to state that the next General Assembly of this State convenes on Wednesday afternoon the first Monday of November, 1878, that is to say on the 5th day, and that the ballot for United States Senator begins on Tuesday following, to-wit, the 12th of the month.

A WORD FROM TILDEN.

WHY HE HAS TO SAY FOR HIMSELF.

He Repudiates the Cipher Telegrams and Makes a Few Remarks About Negotiating For Electoral Votes.

New York, October 17.—A. P. M.—The following card from Mr. Tilden has been given to the press: "I have read the publications in the Tribune of the 9th instant purporting to be translations of cipher telegrams relating to the canvass of votes in Florida at the Presidential election of 1876, and have looked over those printed in the Tribune of this morning relating to the canvass in South Carolina. I have no knowledge of the existence of these telegrams, nor any information about them except what has been derived from them since the publications in the Tribune. So much, for these telegrams generally.

I shall speak yet more specifically as to some of them. First, those which relate to an offer purporting to have been made in behalf of some members of the State board of canvassers to give for a pecuniary consideration certificates for Democratic electors, who had been actually chosen.

Some of these telegrams, no any telegrams communicating such an offer, or suggesting such an offer, relating to such an offer, as was clearly stated to me, or the contents of them in any manner made known to me.

I had no knowledge of the existence or purport of any telegram relating to that subject, or did I believe the fact that such an offer of the Florida certificates had been made until after the 6th of December, at which time the certificates were divided and the electoral vote cast.

The information casually reached me as of a past event. It was accompanied by the statement that the offer had been rejected. Secondly, as to the publication in the Tribune of this morning, purporting to be a translation of cipher telegrams relating to the canvass of votes in South Carolina in 1876, which I have seen since I wrote the foregoing, I can speak of them no less definitely or positively.

No one of such telegrams, either in cipher or translated, was ever shown to or its contents made known to me. No offer or negotiation in behalf of the State canvassers of South Carolina, or any of them, or any dealing with any of them in respect to the certificates to the electors was ever authorized or sanctioned in any manner by me, directly or through any other person.

I shall add that no offer to give the certificates of any returning board or State canvassers of any State to the Democratic electors in consideration of promises of office, or money, or property, or negotiation of any such member, or to influence the action of any elector of President and Vice-President by such motives was ever entertained, considered or tolerated by me or by anybody within my influence by my consent or with my knowledge or acquiescence.

No such contemplated transaction could at any time have come within range of my power without that power being instantly exerted to crush it out. A belief was doubtless current that certificates from Florida conferring to the actual vote of the electors in the market, had no the slightest doubt in the world," said Mr. Stanton, who was in Florida at the time, in a recent interview with the Herald, "that the Florida vote could have been bought if Mr. Tilden had been dishonorable enough to desire it done for a great deal less than \$50,000 or \$20,000. It was known that either one of the two members who composed a majority of the Florida State canvassers could control its action and give certificates to the Democrats: either one of them could settle the Presidential controversy in favor of the Democratic candidate who lacked but one vote."

How accessible to venal documents they were is shown by the testimony of Mr. McLean the chairman of the board of State canvassers, in his examination before the Potter committee in June last. He admitted that the free vote of the people of Florida was in favor of the Democratic electors, and that he never appeared on the face of the public returns, including the true returns from Baker county, notwithstanding the great frauds against the Democrats in some of the county returns. He confessed that, in order to give certificates to the Republican electors, he acted under the full knowledge and promises that should be rewarded in case Mr. Hayes became President. "Adding," he certainly these promises must have had a strong influence over my judgment and action."

After the certificates of the Louisiana returning board had been repeatedly offered to Mr. Bennett and others for money, they were given in favor of the Republican electors, who had been rejected by a large majority of the voters, and members of the board now possess the most important Federal office in that State.

The present charges, it is said, contain that none of these corrupt boards gave their certificates to the Democratic electors, but they all did give them to Republican electors. "I had a perfectly fixed purpose from which I never deviated in word or act, a purpose which was known to or assumed by all with whom I was in habitual communication. If the Presidency of the United States was to be disposed of by certificates to be sent from corrupt returning boards by any form of venal influence, whether of office or money, I was resolved to take no part in the shameful competition, and I took none.

The main interest of the victory which resulted in my election was the expectation that through the Chief Magistracy a system of reforms similar to that which had been accomplished in our metropolis and State administration could be achieved.

In the Federal government, I should be object if it were necessary, I should be compelled by any commitment, in the choice of men to execute the official trust of the government, and free from any obligations to particular interests.

To have surrendered or compromised the advantages of this position by a degrading competition for returning boards, certificates would have been to abandon all that made my victory desirable—everything which could have sustained me in the larger struggles that victory would have imposed upon me. I was resolved to go in to the presidential chair in full command of all my resources for usefulness, or not at all. While thus abstaining from any ignominious competition for such certificates, I saw these certificates as obtained by the Republican electors who had been chosen by the people. These false and fraudulent certificates were now confessed and proven to have been obtained by corrupt inducements, were afterwards made use of to give certificates to the President and Vice-President. These certificates were declared by the Tribunal to which Congress had delegated the functions of deciding the count of disputed electoral votes to be absolute and indisputable. Consequently, the title to the Chief Magistracy of the nation, Florida, which had been held by the Executive, legislative and judicial powers to testify to Congress long before the count, were their genuine agents, which had been statute, caused a reversion, the issue of new certificates, and a formal severance authentication of the right of the electors to deposit their ballots to be conducted, was held to be the right of "electing" to Congress, a fact which cannot now be disputed. Congress, though vested by the constitution with authority to count the electoral votes, though strictly restricted either as to the time when it should receive evidence or as to the nature of the evidence, and though subjected to no appeal from its decision was declared to have no power to guide its own count by any information it could obtain or by any authority which it might accept from the wronged and betrayed States.

RESUMPTION COMING. Secretary Sherman says he will have \$135,000,000 in Gold Coin on which to begin—a Republican prophecy.

WASHINGTON, October 19.—Secretary Sherman says that there is not the least anxiety in his mind regarding the success of resumption on the 2d of January next. On that day the assistant treasurer of New York will be prepared to pay out for greenbacks, in sums of fifty dollars on its multiple, to all who come. He said it would be impossible for speculators to make any trouble or embarrass the government in carrying out the law. It is possible that they may carry gold by a point or two, but this will not interfere with resumption. The Secretary says there are now in the vaults in New York over \$100,000,000 in gold coin, to say nothing of silver, and that by the 1st of January there will be at least \$135,000,000 of coin to begin resumption with. The Secretary wishes that every important question of the government was as easily disposed of as the resumption of specie payments.

A CALAMITY TO SCOTLAND.

Something About the Effects of the Failure of the City of Glasgow Bank.

Glasgow, October 21.—The directors of the City of Glasgow Bank, who were arrested Saturday on a charge of fraud were today arraigned before a stentorian magistrate of Glasgow and remanded till Monday.

LONDON, October 21.—The Times financial article says: "The local newspapers published this morning the news that the City of Glasgow Bank had been closed for the majority of the shareholders. Some of them cannot pay anything, and in consequence there will be a heavy draft on the residuum, who are rich. These drafts will paralyze business, weaken credit, and pry a source of misery to Scotland for years. The banking world has received a shock which is itself one of the greatest calamities which the country could undergo. Confidence is shaken at a time when the condition of trade requires it to be as firm as steel. The mischief thus done is not only beginning to be revealed, but it is already spreading good will result from this collapse, but in the meanwhile it hangs over the country like a nightmare, and nobody can be sure that it may not prove a signal for many further disasters. At the same time nothing is to be done except to be more reasoning suspicion. We are glad to find that there is in all the banks of London a strong feeling of confidence and readiness to help those requiring it, which must go far to prevent any extreme danger. If the business public is as sensible as we hope of the London bank managers, the worst that could happen may probably be avoided."
