A proposition has been made by a limited number of citizens, no doubt with the best of intentions, to induce the county commissioners to enforce a medical examination of the children attending public schools. 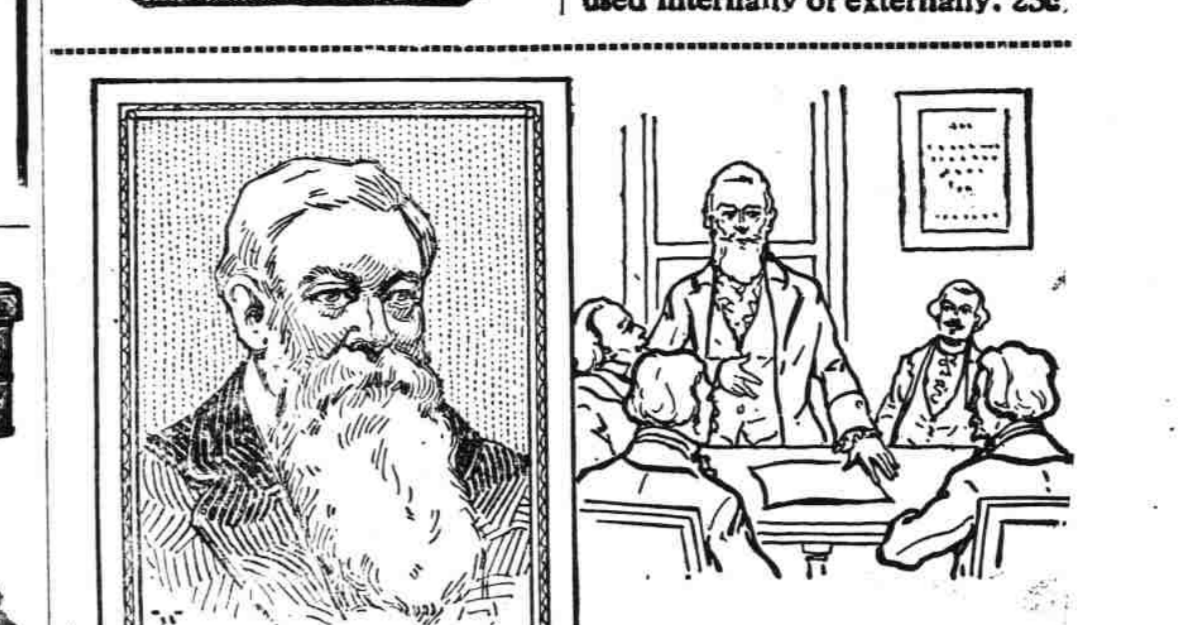
