**Death of W. A. Fowler.**

W A Fowler, who was superintendent of the Salisbury Cotton Mills, aged about 50 years, died Monday afternoon after a brief illness, having been stricken Friday with appendicitis. The funeral was held from the residence on

South Main street Tuesday afternoon, being conducted by Rev. J H Brendall of South Main street Methodist church, and the interment was in Chestnut Hill cemetery. Mr. Fowler leaves a wife and eight children three of whom are married and five are living at home. Deceased was one of the most prominent and influential citizens of Chestnut Hill, and had for eighteen years been superintendent of the Salisbury Cotton Mills.

**Death of W. T. Kincaid.**

W T Kincaid of Statesville, a native of the southwestern portion of Franklin Township, this county, died at his home in Statesville Monday noon from the effects of paralysis. The funeral was held at the residence at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon, Dr. C E Raynal officiating. The interment being Oakwood, Statesville. The Landmark has the following in reference to his death:

'Some months ago Mr. Kincaid suffered a slight stroke of paralysis. He was confined but a few days at the time but he did not regain his health and his friends feared the worst. On the 22nd of March he suffered a second stroke and since then his death had been expected at any hour.

'William Thomas Kincaid, 59 years old, was born and reared in Franklin church neighborhood, Rowan County. In 1888 he and his brother, E L Kincaid, engaged in the lumber business under the firm name of Kincaid Bros. and the partnership continued to the present. For a time they were located at Rock Cut (now Eufola), later at Cleveland and since about 1902 they have lived in Statesville. For a time they were interested in furniture manufacturing in Statesville and for some years they have had a business at Mocksville.

About 25 years ago Mr. Kincaid married Miss Vay Steele of Rowan, who survives him. Five years later his brother, H L Kincaid, married a sister of Mrs. W T Kincaid, and the two brothers and their wives lived together from the time of their marriage until a few years ago. In addition to his wife Mr. Kincaid is survived by three brothers: Messrs. H L of Statesville, J B of Cleveland and J J Kincaid of Maxton.

Mr. Kincaid was in all respects a good man and true gentle, kind hearted, considerate, upright, he was greatly beloved by a large circle of friends who feel a personal loss in his death. He was a member of the First Presbyterian church.

He was a son of W M Kincaid well remembered here by the older citizens. Mrs. J P Moore went up to attend the funeral.

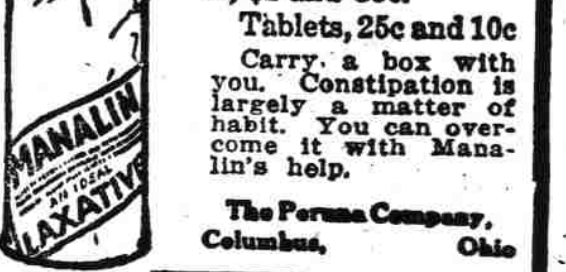
