### Ex-Czar Alive is the Latest Report.

The Hague, June 28.—A dispatch received at midnight says the court marshal at Darmstadt states that through the Russian Minister at Berlin he has received reports from which it appears former Czar Nicholas is safe.

Amsterdam, June 28.—A Berlin dispatch says that according to a telegram received there from Kiev, a member of the soviet government announced that the reports that former Emperor Nicholas had been brought before a revolutionary tribunal and that he had been assassinated both are incorrect. The government official added that Nicholas and his family were in good health.

### Three Dead, Result of Auto Accident.

Greensboro, June 29.—Miss Mary Windsor and Nellie Boland and Raymond Barger are dead, and Jeff Burton is not expected to live, as a result of an automobile accident at the Haw River crossing of the Southern Railway, two miles south of Reidsville, at 1 o'clock this morning. A freight train going south struck the auto in which the party was returning to Reidsville from Greensboro.

Miss Windsor was instantly killed. Barber died on the way, and Miss Boland succumbed at the hospital. Miss Boland and Barber, who was driving, were to have been married. All were from Reidsville.

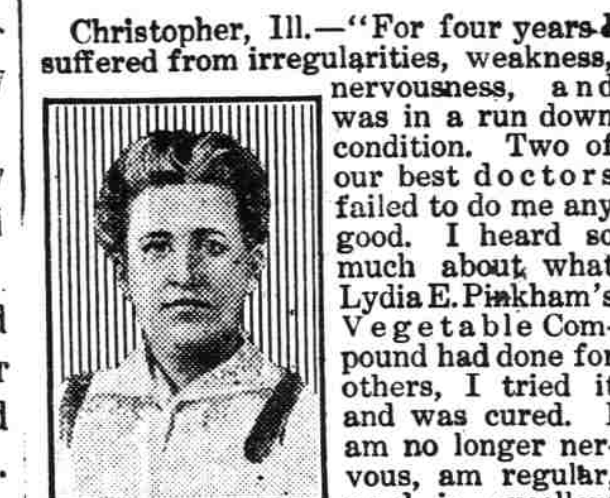
### Prohibition Amendment.

Carrying an amendment providing for national prohibition as a war measure, but not fully effective until June 30, 1919, the eleven million dollar emergency agricultural appropriation bill has been reported to the Senate. The present plan is to call it up after the army bill is disposed of and a bitter fight is expected by many Senators.

The prohibition amendment, offered by Senator Norris of Nebraska, as a substitute for that by Senator Jones of Washington was adopted by the Senate Agricultural committee, 8 to 3. It prohibits the sale of distilled spirits and the manufacture of wine or the removal of liquors now held in bond after June 30, 1919. The manufacture of beer would be stopped three months after passage of the bill.

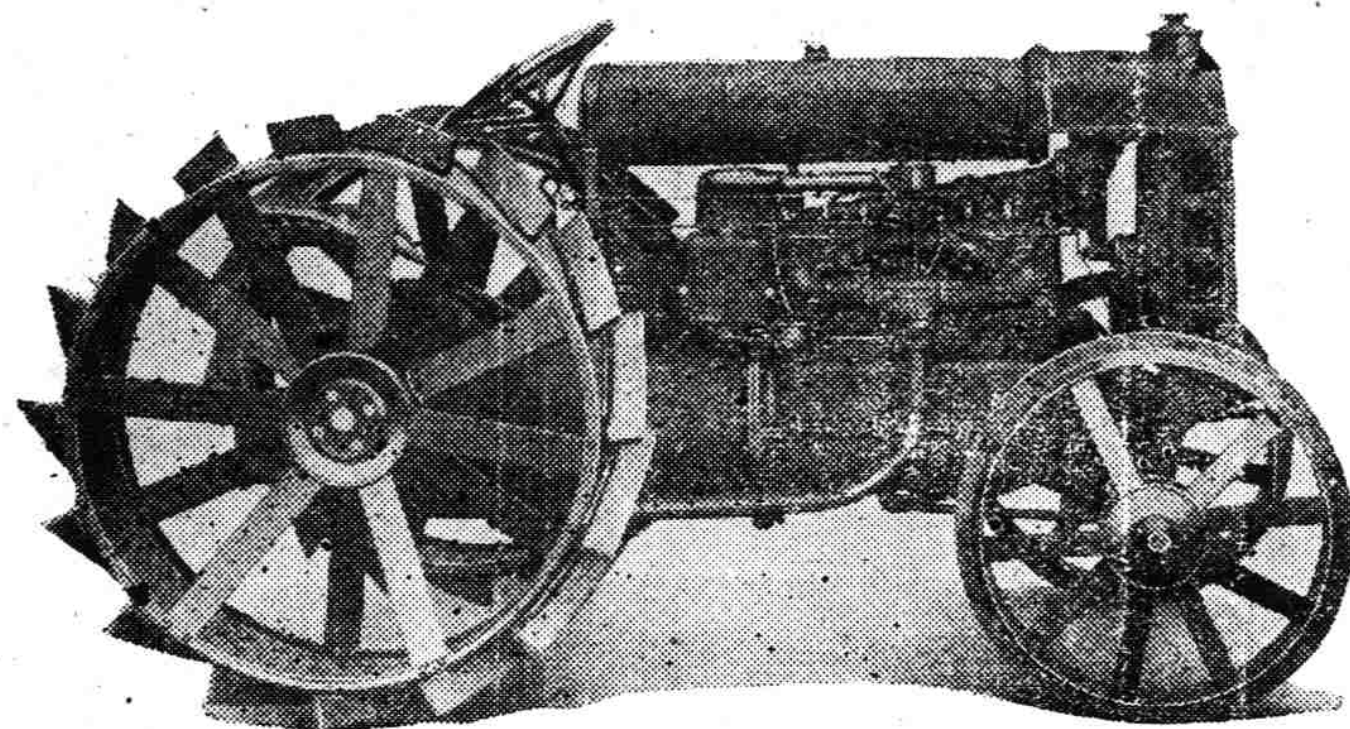
