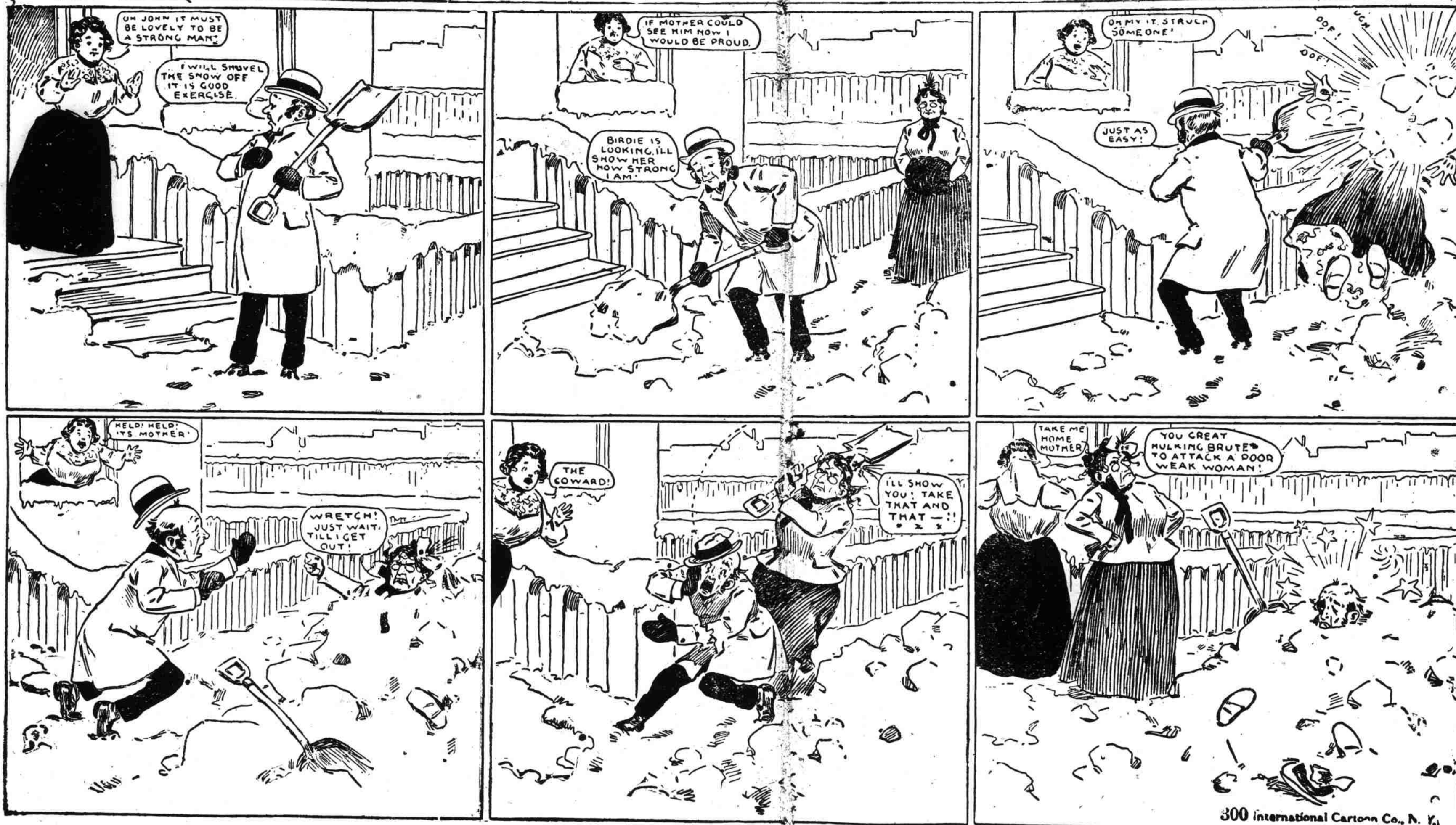
Wounded Soldiers Here.
 There were twenty-four wounded soldiers here for several hours Saturday night having come in from the north on No 35 and left on western No 35 for the government recruiting hospital in Waynesville. These men were from the Chateau Thierry sector, where they were engaged for some time in actual warfare in the front line trenches. They had been gassed by the deadly

German gas shells. They arrived in America last week and hope to recover in the next three months sufficiently to be able to return to the foreign field to engage in active service in some capacity and while here these men were served and given attention by the canteen workers and a number of autoists took parties of them on an automobile ride about the city.
