The principal of these charges is under stood to be based on an alleged col-Insion between two of the detectives and George McDonnell, lately convicted of forgery, in London. It is alleged that McDonnell was allowed to retain a large amount of money which should have been seized and delivered to Mr. Dacosta, the Representative of the Bank of England in this country. McDonnell, it is said, made an affidavit embodying his knowledge of the case and sent it to the District Attorney. The list of charges were prepared by the Assistant District Attorney and forwarded to Police Commissioner, Duryea.




