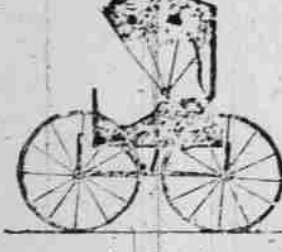

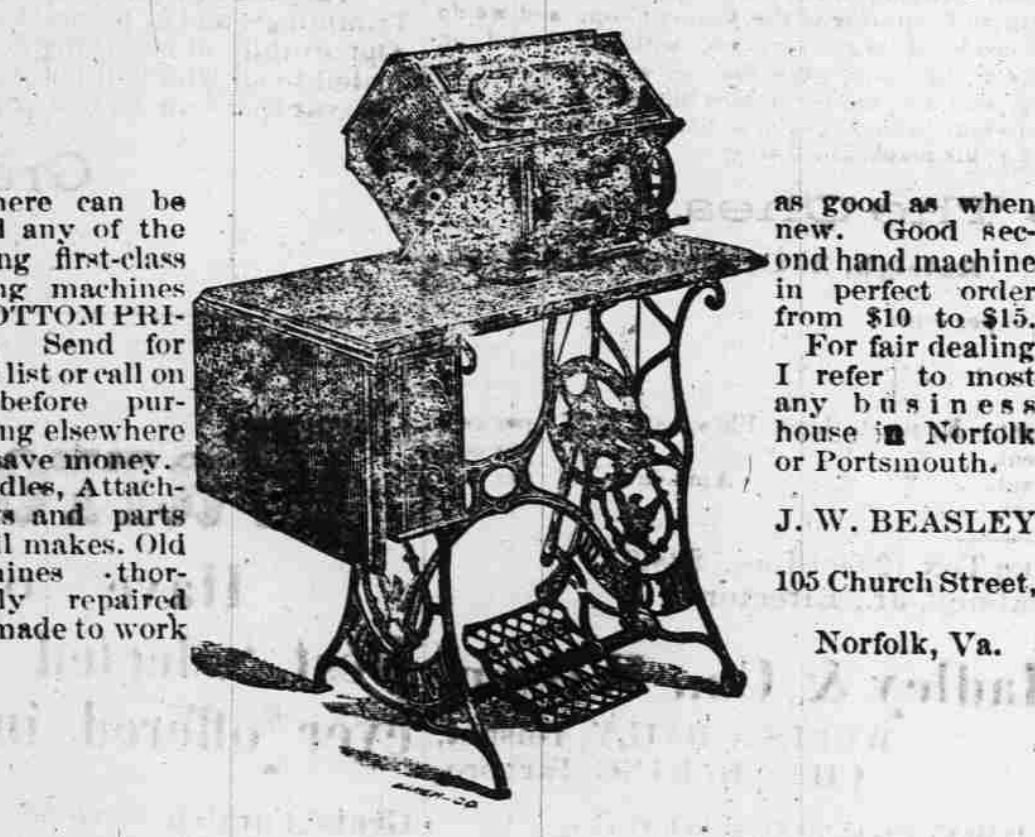

tie that bound them more closely
