TOTAL ABSTINENCE SAVING WINE TILL IT RIPEXS.

There is a curious story about some native wines which are extensively advertised nawadays, and have only recently been put upon the market. Dr. Underhill, the well-known grape-grower of Croton Point, died in 1871. Some of his hers entertained temperance views of ruth current head that they were unwilling to allow the stock of wines then on a band to be sold or new over to be made. hand to be sold or any more to be made.
