

TOTAL ABSTINENCE SAVING WINE TILL IT RIPESS.

There is a curious story about some native wines which are catenarely advertised nowadays, and have only recently been put upon the market. Dr. Underhill, the well-known grape-grower of Croton Point, died in 1871. Some of his heirs entertained temperance views of such extreme kind, that they were unwilling to allow the stock of wines then on hand to be sold or any more to be made. 


