"Under favorable conditions and en vironment the individual should live out he potential longevity. With unfavorble conditions this longevity may be carefully scrutinized the fair American.

"The primary conditions of longevity," he continues, "are that the heart, lungs, and digestive organs, as well as the brain, The brain will be deeply seated, as shown sands, called on his God. by the orifice of the ear being low. 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
