LEGISLATIVE PROCEEDINGS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina In Regular Session

January 19.—Senator Boyd, of Rowan, introduced a bill to create a State high commission, whose duty it would be to co-operate with counties and towns in road building.

Bill by Horne, of Johnston, to authorize Board of Agriculture to pay dept. of A. & M. College Agricultural building from receipts of oil tax revenue.

Only bills of a local nature passed and then by joint resolution regarding celebration of the 104th anniversary of the birth of Gen. R. E. Lee, both the Senate and House adjourned.

Jan. 20.—Introduced simultaneously in the house and senate, by Dillard in the former and Hobbins in the latter, a bill to prohibit the shipment of live quail from the State and revoking the power of the secretary of the Audubon society to issue permits for such shipments, was passed by both bodies of the General Assembly.

Senator Garner's bill to increase the Governor's salary from \$4,000 to \$6,000 annually, effective at the expiration of Governor Kirtland's term of office, was reported favorably by the committee on salaries and fees.

Jan. 21.—The special legislative committee urges the adoption of a system that will better secure and commercialize land titles and the manner of applying the Torrens system of land titles in North Carolina.

The bill was raffled preventing the shipping of live quail out of the State.

Bill introduced by Boyd, of Rowan to appropriate \$25,000 for a suitable monument on the battlefield of Gettysburg to honor the memory of North Carolina troops.

Bills have been introduced for the creation of several new counties, notably North Robeson, South Robeson, Hoke county out of parts of Cumberland and Robeson, Piedmont out of parts Guilford, Davidson and Randolph.

The fact is evident, however, that this legislature is averse to the creation of any new counties, more especially so since the emphasis that has been given the fact that 58 counties of the State are now on the "pauper list" as costing the State more than they pay in State taxes.

The opinion is freely expressed by many that they are more inclined to consolidate some of those already in existence.

Monday, Jan. 23.—Representative Battle, of Wake, introduced in the house a bill to make the minimum age of children working in factories 14 years.

Ewart, in the house, offered a resolution to the effect that a legislative commission of five be appointed to investigate as to charges being made that the American Tobacco company is openly violating the antitrust law of North Carolina.

Kelly introduced a bill to provide for Superior courts to convene on Tuesdays instead of Monday.
