The Guilford Battle Ground Company has decided to the U. S. Government a site 100 feet square on Guilford battlefield for the erection of the \$30,000 monument to General Nathaniel Greene, who commanded the American forces in this great battle. The site selected for the monument is about 100 feet southeast of the Nash monument. It is understood that the government will erect the monument during this year and the unveiling exercises will take place at the fourth of July celebration in 1912.

The woman suffrage bill was rejected by the New York Senate by the close vote of 17 to 16.
