

SHOULD ACT AT ONCE.

City Light and Power Plant for Weldon.

Weldon now has an opportunity to install a city lighting plant in connection with water works that should not be overlooked. There is no franchise or obliga-

tion in favor of any private corporconnection with water works, the pumping of water can be done 50 00 during the same hours the town is as oo being lighted, requiring the time of 12 50 one engineer, one fireman and one 10 00 superintendent to operate both systems and by thus dividing the ex-1 00 pense both may be started on a 1 00 paying basis. It is necessary, however, to act quickly. A power plant suitable to operate both systems should be 10 02 installed and this can be done much 5.50 more cheaply than if water works are first installed and electric lights \$246 84 added afterwards. The present arrangement is intensely unsausfactory with no one to blame. A 50 00 change is necessary, and it is now 12 10 necessary for the city to act or give a franchise to a private corporation for a period of years, if we are to 1 00 have satisfactory service, which


