**WAS OF ITALIAN PARENTAGE**

Preponderance of Evidence Seems to Refute Claim That Columbus Had Jewish Blood Strain.

Christopher Columbus, the great navigator, was an Italian, born in Italy, of Italian parentage. He was the eldest son of Don Domingo Columbus and Susanna Frontanaco, and was born at Genoa either about 1446 or in 1451, the exact date is uncertain. His father was a wool comber of some small means and he lived till 1498. In a book entitled "The Conquering Jew," by Sir John Fraser, published in London in 1913 (Casella) it is stated that Columbus was "himself half Jew," but on such claim to make in Peter Wenzel's "History of the Jews in America" (New York, 1914). The Jewish Encyclopedia (New York, 1903), has an article on "Christopher Columbus and the Jews," in which it is said that "according to his own statements, Columbus had constant intercourse with Jews and Moors, with profits and losses," but no mention is made of any Jewish strain in the great navigator himself.

**COOKING BY ELECTRICITY**

Introducing a new departure, the Great Northern Railway company, in England, has equipped the kitchen of one of its dining cars with electric cooking apparatus, says Popular Mechanics Magazine. Power for the apparatus is furnished by two generators, which are belt-driven from the axles of the trucks, each having a rating of six kilowatts. In the kitchen, across one end, is the main cooking range and roasting oven, with a steaming oven above it, while over the latter a grill and a hot water tank are located. A boiling range, having four hot plates, two ten-gallon boiling pans for vegetables, and a fish fryer, are also included in the installation, which has yielded such satisfactory results that the company is seriously considering similar equipment for other trains.

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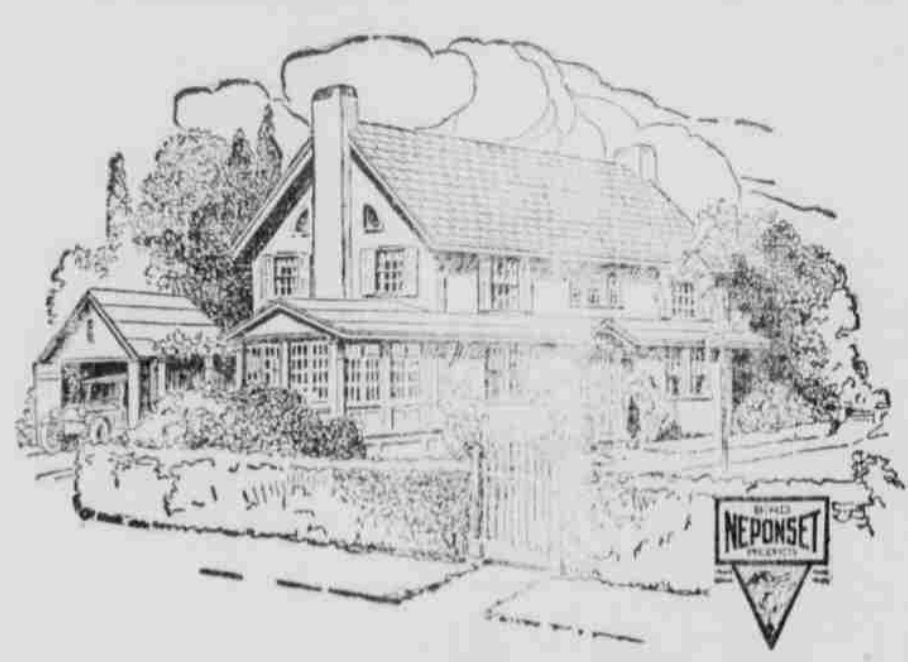
