But for reasons which need not be publicly stated, but which will be given to our friends and all who are interested in the failure, its Editor decided upon suspension as the wisest and most honorable course to pur-

sue. The editor of the Sun has heard that there were certain rumors in circulation affecting the conduct of the paper under him. The Sun has never been influenced in the slightest degree by any person whatever. Its editor alone has shaped its policy. He alone has been responsible for its course on all questions.
