The House refused to pass the bill over the veto by a vote of 83 to 63.

At 2:30 another message was receiv ed from the President and was read, calling the attention of the House to the importance of making some, provision for marshals, saying that under existing laws prohibiting the incurment of liabilities outside of appropriations, the Executive could not command their services, and that the suspension of their functions, for even a short time, wou d be inconsistent with public interests and might at any moment prove inconsistent with the public safety.

The message was referred to the Appropriations Committee, as was also a letter from the Attorney General on the same subject, presented by Mr Atkin, of Tennessee.

After disposing of some unimportant business on the Speaker's table, the House took up and passed, under the suspension of the rules, the bill originally introduced by Mr McKinzic, of Kentucky, putting salts, quinine and sulphate of quinine on the free list. The vote stood 125 to 32.


