THE YELLOW FEVER

No New Cases Reported and Citizens Returning to Memphis.

MEMPHIS, July 15-The first train on the Little Rock Railroad since last Friday left this morning for Lonoke, Ark, to which quarautine has been raised. Judge Ray s son was not so well to day. No new cases have been reported, and the excitement attending the reports already published has entirely subsided. A few eitizens have returned.

The city remains very quiet. No new cases are reported, and in a few days it is expected all the quarantine restrictions now in force against Memphis will be removed. Norfork, Va., has taken the in-Itiative, and through cars will go to that Middling city to-day. The State Board of Health Good Middling. announces that the present quarantine regulations will be discontinued on Mon day if no new cases are developed. Judge Ray's son is better this evening,

WASHINGTON, July 15 .- A despatch was received to-day by the National Board of Health from Dr Mitchell of Memphis, Tenn, saying that there were no new cases of yellow fever in the State

NASHVILLE, July 15 -The State Board of Health this morning resolved to suspend until further orders its rules and regulations now imposed on Memphis next Monday noon, provided no other that time.

Carno, July 15 -At a meeting of the Board of Health this forenoon it was resolved that owing to the favorable news | Geo Myers. from Memphis and other parts of the South, all quarantine restrictions be suspended.

HAVANA, July 15-The Commission appointed by the National Board of Health of the United States for the purpose of studying yellow fever symptone, development, and treatment in Havana is prosecuting its work here assiduously. Much local interest is manifested in the work, and hopes of beneficent results are entertained.

During the last week there were 117 deaths from yellow fever in Havana. NEW ORLEANS, July 15-The Board of Health to-day adopted a resolution rescinding quarant no against Memphis.
