Durham Recorder: On Sunday

night a barn of Mr Lye Howard, five

miles North of Durham, was burn-

ed, with its contents, consisting of about

six hundred sticks of tobacco, entail-

ing a probable loss of about \$300.

Raleigh News: Stephen Bell, en-

gaged in Willis Aver's plantation, in

Johnston county, the old "Northrop

Belt" place, commenced picking cotton

on Monday, September 8th, and this

is the result of his work for eight con-

secutive days, excluding Sunday: 130,

250, 35, 375, 34, 65, 321, 190; total,

1,755 pounds. The cotton gave out in

the days the smallest picking was done,

or the aggregate would have footed

to a good round amount.

Raleigh Observer: A negro who

died recently, at Oxford, N. C., was fa-

therly declare has reduced the price of raw

material at Liverpool. —The workmen

at Corsett, Jarrow, Stockton and Har-

pool struck against the award of Mr Dale,

the arbitrator in the great dispute in

the North-eastern iron trade, he
