Not Far Wrong.

The *Newbernian*, quoting from a paper published in this city, says: Wilmington is situated 80 miles from Smithville, 6 miles from the seacoast, 80 miles from Goldsboro, 160 miles from Weldon, 140 miles from Newbern, 130 miles from Raleigh, 100 miles by river Fayetteville, 188 miles from Charlotte. He didn't miss it far, having got it wrong in only six (and possibly seven) instances. Wilmington is 28 miles from Smithville, 8 miles from the seacoast, 84 miles from Goldsboro, 162 miles from Weldon, 133 miles from Raleigh, 112 miles by river to Fayetteville and 188 miles to Charlotte. We don't know how far it is from Newbern.
