It raged both Friday and Saturday, and was, according to the News, the fiercest gale ever known there. We cannot begin to give a list of the disasters. The list, in its entirety, would take two pages of the Review. The following heading, from the News, will indicate something of the extent of the disaster: "The city and suburbs in the clutches of a hurricane—all the favorite resorts visited with wreck and ruin—a night of fear and peril—the streets littered with debris and blocked with prostrate trunks—stores and dwellings sluiced—Tybee cut off—death and destruction on the island—loss of life elsewhere—the wires down in all directions—disasters feared along the coast—no news from the outside world."
