The students of Washington and Jefferson College, at Washington, Pa. recently held a mock National Convention and nominated Senator Edmunds for President.

A Washington letter says: "Mr. Blaine said to-day to a warm personal friend who called upon him: I do not expect myself to be nominated, and furthermore I do not expect to see Mr. Arthur nominated, but I think, next to Edmunds, the man who is most likely to receive the nomination is Senator Sherman."

London is threatened with a small-pox scare. The malady is alarmingly prevalent in several of the metropolitan districts, and is spreading from the city to the adjoining provinces, several of which are already badly infected.

A very large proportion of the textile manufactures of the country is located in the nine easternmost States of the Union—New England, New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. Of the \$20,000,000 of capital invested in the manufacture of cotton goods, according to the last census, \$192,000,000—88 per cent. of the whole—was in these States.

That first gun fired by Tammany the other night made a big noise, and gave a bigger boom than ever to "the old ticket," which, by the way, is now talked of by all men. Hon. Thos. L. Clingman, of this State, was one of the Vice-Presidents.

"Resolved, That the efforts of the great majority of the Democratic party in the House of Representatives to reduce taxation under the Morrison bill—only defeated by a few misguided Democrats acting with their political opponents—receive our warmest praise, and we hereby tender them our thanks for their honest exertions. The representatives whose action thus relegated the question of tariff reform to the future, we leave to the justice of their constituents, who, by their work, will continue to pay 100 per cent. tax on rice and blankets, 50 per cent. tax on sugar, and from 50 per cent. to 100 per cent. tax on many of the necessities of life."

"According to the revelations of President Garfield, the army of the United States was concentrated in, and around the capital by order of President Grant to prevent the representatives of the people from electing a President in the mode provided in the constitution, the rank usurpation practiced by a military tyrant. The usurpation was consummated and the assassin of self-government were severally rewarded out of the public treasury,

and as yet the greatest fraud of the century has not been punished. To repress this wrong becomes the paramount duty of the Democracy in the coming Presidential campaign. To attain this end we ask the earnest cooperation of every Democrat and every American citizen."

The New York World talks some plain talk in regard to the causes of the defeat of the tariff bill when it says: At the Tammany Hall meeting Congressmen Blackburn alluded to the defeat of the Morrison bill, and characterized as "traitors" the forty-one Democrats to whom, under Mr. Randall, he attributes its slaughter.
