**PUBLIC HEALTH.**

**The Essential Means for its Improvement and Preservation—Thorough Drainage and Pure Water the most Important Elements.**

The writer of this has no object in view but the sanitary good of the community in which he lives, and with that only as an excuse for troubling the citizens of Wilmington with a short discussion upon the best means of restoring the usual good health—and maintaining it—of the city, he will give the result of the observations of himself and others upon this subject.

First, then, he would advise the organization of a "Public Health Association" as a means of improvement. It may surprise those acquainted with the very high and healthy location of the city of Newport, R. I., to know that it became necessary to organize such an association there before the people were able to obtain such sanitary improvements as they deemed necessary for the improvement and future preservation of the public health. Those desirous of examining this subject are referred to the Report to the National Board of Health by Dr Horatio R. Storer, of Newport, R. I., for 1878. Other reports on southern cities, Memphis, Mobile, &c., are also referred to, but I have selected a northern city especially, as presumed to be more free from malarial diseases than those in southern semi-tropical locations. The first means I have recommended was a public health association. Second, a thorough system of drainage. Third, the paving of the streets in the lower portions of the city or covering them with some material that will carry the water (rain fall) into the gutters by which it should be conveyed at the street corners into sewer pipes and thence to the river or, if East of the summit, into the creek East side of the city, where it will also reach tide water.

The system of thorough drainage here recommended includes a system of sewerage by which not only the surface water is rapidly removed from the streets, but to which every lot owner and householder can and should convey a pipe from his yard, by means of which all liquid offal is removed and carried to running water and there rendered harmless. Most of the southern cities of 20,000 or more inhabitants have adopted some compulsory system of drainage and garbage removal by which its citizens are protected from the dangers of diseases, such as typhoid fever now prevailing here to a greater degree than known before, and from diphtheria, to which we are liable from the poisoning of the air by want of proper sanitary drainage. Will any one read the history of the drainage system adopted at Memphis under the direction of that able sanitary engineer, Col Geo. E. Waring by which that "cholera-horror" during the yellow fever of a few years ago has been rendered a comparatively healthy city, without wishing, at least, that Wilmington could undergo a similar transformation and be rendered more healthy. Not thinking that Wilmington is very unhealthy, but that its sanitary condition could be so materially improved by sanitary drainage at a comparatively small cost, as to render typhoid fever and diphtheria of rare occurrence.

The plan of drainage desired would consist in taking the water off the street and vacant lots and carry it into regular running water by which all impure water can be disposed of, and prevent disease from putrid or decomposing matter in stagnant pools.

**METHOD OF DOING THIS WORK.**

Begin at Market street dock and lay an 18 inch sewer pipe four feet below the surface of the street along its center line as far up as Second street; from that point lay a 15 inch pipe to Third street, east side, and stop there for the present. Connect by side pipes of proper dimensions the corners of the street gutters with this sewer, and require all house yards to connect by small pipes with this sewer—and all holes, "cesspools" and the like to be filled up, and all filthy drainage to be conveyed to this sewer. A smaller pipe could be run from Third street up Market to the summit, to which all yards should be required to connect by a pipe of proper size, generally four inch pipes large enough, and cast of Third street a pipe 8 to 10 inches in diameter would be large enough to carry off all the drainage. This plan will so far remove the rainfall or storm water from the surface that no more overflowing of Market and Dock streets will occur. Lots can be drained of water, both filthy and otherwise, and a vast improvement in the health of the city will be obtained.

The cost of the main sewer pipe laid will average about one dollar per foot, laid down. The city should pay one-half the cost and lot owners the other half, or the city one-third and the lot owners one-third each, on each side of the street. This cost is but trifling when we consider the great benefits to be obtained. A lot of 66 feet front, \$32. The Richmond law, or city ordinance, provides that all lot owners who do not pay the assessment on their lots, or who desire time on it, a tax equal to 8 per cent. on the one-third cost is collected annually until the assessment is paid. This would be \$1.76 per annum for the sewer for a 66 feet lot.

When shall we have so cheap a system and one so efficient for good health established here? **SANITARY.**
