In discussing the question what would follow upon the contingency of the Lords throwing out the franchise bill, a second time after it passes the House of Commons again at the autumn session, the English papers are of opinion that Parliament would not therefore be forthwith dissolved.

The special telegraphic reports of the proceedings of the last two National Conventions were unprecedented for their accuracy and completeness. For the four days of the Republican Convention 1,660,178 words were telegraphed special through one of the companies, an average of 415,000 words a day.

A Washington letter says: "There is no concealing the fact that the Republicans are a good deal annoyed at the result of the Prohibition Convention at Pittsburg. Their more cautious leaders don't admit this publicly, but in private they acknowledge that the action of the Convention in making nominations is very unfortunate for the Republican party."
