The New York Herald and the New York World both rejoice at the result of the election in Vermont and see in its signs of the victory to be achieved by the Democrats in November. The Herald says: The shrinkage of the Republican vote in Vermont yesterday, as compared with the September election of 1880, appears to be in a proportion which will assure the election of Governor Cleveland to the Presidency by a great majority in the electoral college, if it is repeated throughout the Northern States.

There is nothing discouraging to Democracy in the result of the election in Vermont yesterday. Vermont is the rock-ribbed, granite-based fortress of Republicanism. It is the Gibraltar of the party. Its population is fixed, its prejudices are ingrained and there is little or no political change in Vermont.

Four years ago, at the gubernatorial election, the Republicans had a plurality of 26,603. Judging from the returns received from yesterday's election the plurality this year will not exceed 21,000. The stay-at-home Republican vote seems to have been unusually large.

It is gratifying to know that in Stewart Vermont there is a desire for a change and a purification of the Government which the "magnetism" of Blaine cannot deflect. To stir up any sort of Republican revolt in Vermont is a victory for the friends of Reform.
