



Iu Asia, in the neighborhood of Calcutta, in Arabia, near Mecca, and in Egypt, not far from Cairo, are the breeding places of cholera. There famine is a frequent occurrence. The people grow up surrounded by filth such as an American citizen has not the faintest idea of, and an infectious disease finds the most favorable corditions for its development in those unhealthy districts. The pilgrims who in thousands yearly proceed from Egypt to Mecca, and who live off the poorest food and amid the greatest squalor, carry with them the seed of cholera, and thus mission of the disease from Asia to Renewer." Africa. If we consider the commercial importance of Alexandria, we cannot wonder that the cholera, once epidemic in Egypt, should swiftly travel to Europe. Thus far medical history has not recorded a single instance of an original outbreak of cholera anywhere but at the places mentioned. Filth seems to be the sine qua non of its

powerful barrier to its march. The fact has been established that the human being alone acts as the carrier of the cholera poison. There is no well authenticated case on record where rags or clothing, as has been proven of vellow fever, had transmittek the infectious material of the Asiatic disease. In olden times, when no railroads, no steamships, hastened the travel, the march of cholera kept pace with the rapidity, respectively slowness, of hu man intercourse The disease either followed the road of the great tea caravans, which brought the high-prized leaves from Asia to Russia, or it traveled the usual ways of commerce across the Mediterranean sea.


