A question of interest in the Alaska controversy relates to the probable number of seals in and around Behring Sea. A computation last spring by Agent Noyes gave 6,557, 750 as the total number of breeding seals on the two islands of St. Paul and St. George, the seats of the Alaska Commercial Company's monopoly. Agent Tingle's report estimates the number at fewer than 5,000,000. The Commercial Company employs, according to the Toronto Mail, a fleet of four steamers and fifteen sailing vessels in its operations, and has stations on the Aleutian Isles as well as on the mainland. It is charged by some of the enemies of the Alaska Company that it kills over 200,000 seals a year, or twice as many as its lease allows; but its official resorts insist that only 104,828 were killed for the last year in procuring its 100,000 skins. The highest reasonable estimates of skins taken by the poachers during profitable Persons of either sexeasily earn the year is 30,000. It is stated in the Panama Canal Company's official bulletin, as quoted by the Panama Star and Herald. that the excavation for the month of July "on the canal proper" amounted to 570,000 cubic meters their own benefit write for particulars. Used | 49,000 meters of which represent the work done in the Culebra section. This section includes the highest elevation, and is the most formidable of all the divisions. But at this rate the completion of the canal will require more than the nineteen years indicated as M. Leroy Beaulieu has shown by the official record of work done in the Culebra. The excavation of 49. 900 meters in a month is a very poor fulfilment of the glowing promise made by M. de Lesseps at a meeting of shareholders in 1885. Having said that there were 20,000,000 meters to be removed in the Culebra section he announced that the contrac tors in charge proposed to take out 610,000 meters a month from January 1, 1886, to July 1, 1887, and thereafter, when the cut should have become deep, 300,000 meters a month. But the President of the canal company is sometimes guilty of exaggeration.

Not only would such a policy fice. have been strenuously resisted by the British colonies, but, had it been carried out, these colonies would to involve the Home Government in hostilities over the matter. French penal colonies, through a curious confusion of mind in the French Government as to what can be done with them, have become literally breeding places of vice and of vicious men and women. The evidence is incontestable that, with the mistaken purpose of helping to reform criminals by the introduction of family ties, the French have stocked portions of their pena establishment with men and women, who are allowed to reproduce their kind with the practical certainty that the offspring will be trained in vice. The English colonists could not be expected to tolerate any extension of such a system near their shores, and they have made it perfectly plain to the English Government that they would not do so.
