## A committee of the faculty of Har vard College has jost submitted to that

 that body a report on the wholesubject of athleties and athletic
sports in ocllege, which is in the
main very favorable to their encourmain very favorable to the ir encour
magement. Certain objections brought
agen against them are fally considere
by the committee. Whith regard to vorable to the hiealth of the sta-
deats, the committee concludes emphatically to the contrary. It says
aiso, that athleteic sports "to not
serionsly interere" seriously interfere" with attendance
on college eourses; that partiecipa on college oourses; that participa
tion in them lowers neither the standing of thosewho take part it
them nor the general standiug the college, and that they have in the main "a good moral influience"
apon thyse who take part in the upon those who take part in them
and who witness shem. In the ex-
penses which they involve no serious objeetion is found. About 400
