Quarantine Notice.
BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE COUNTY
OF NEW HANOVER.
THOMAS F. WOOD, M. D., Secretary.
WILMINGTON, N. C., Aug. 10, 1888.
WHEREAS, It has come to the knowledge of
the County Board of Health of the County of
New Hanover that yellow fever exists in
Jacksonville, Fla.,
It is hereby declared by the said Board that
inland quarantine shall be established this
day upon the railroads leading into this city
by authority of the general statutes, Code,
Sec. 2883.
It is hereby ordered that two detectives
shall be stationed at Meares' Bluff, who shall
thoroughly examine every "sleeper" and
other passenger coaches, forbidding any per-
sons coming from Jacksonville or towns south
of that point entering Wilmington.
Resolved, That a committee of two be ap-
pointed to wait on the railroad authorities to
consult with them in order to perfect such
plans as will thoroughly carry out a suffi-
cient quarantine.
Ordered, that the above resolutions and or-
ders shall be made public.
