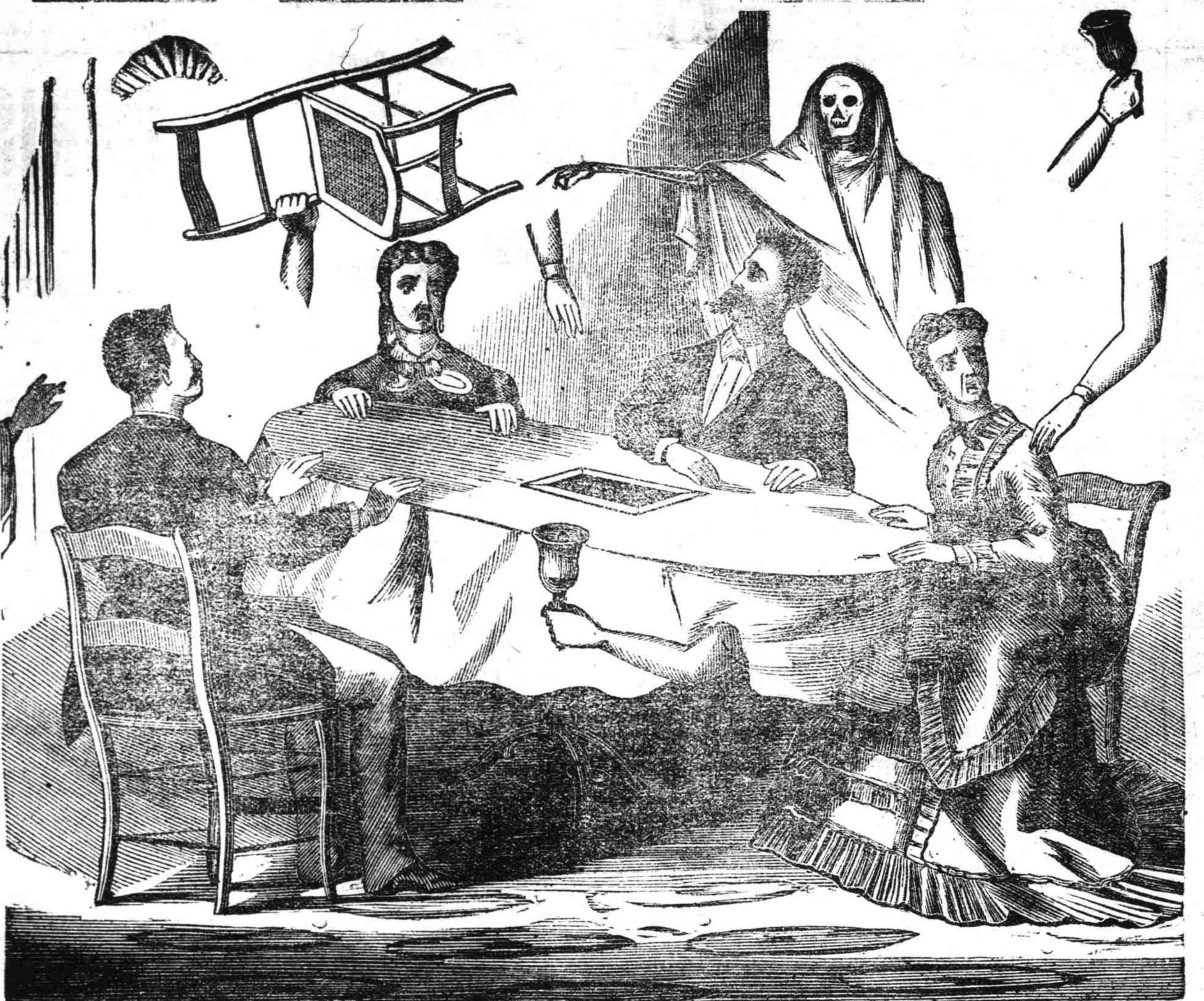

WILMINGTON, N. C., Aug. 13th, 1888.
AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF
Health of New Hanover County, a committee
of the Produce Exchange and Commercial Ex-
change, the following was adopted:
Resolved, That such a detail of officers as
may be necessary shall inspect all trains en-
tering Florence by either of the railroads from
the South, warning all persons coming from
Florida or other points infected with yellow
fever, and intending to come to Wilmington,
that they will be put off the train at a point
not nearer the city than Brinkley's Station,
on the W. C. & A. R. R., or Abbottsburg, on
the C. C. R. R. at their own risk and expense,
and that baggage belonging to persons com-
ing from suspected points shall not be allowed
to come to the city, or if it reach the city it
shall be destroyed.
Resolved, That a further detail be located at
Maxton, with like instruction, and the guard
at Meares' Bluff and the Y. nearer the railroad
be continued as at present.
Also, 1,000 hand-bills, reciting foregoing res-
olutions, be struck off, for the purpose of being
distributed on all railroad trains coming from
the South.
