Cheap Books.

We appear to be entering another era of cheap books. There is a flood of paper-covered literature flowing from the presses, and publishers are rivalling each other in the production of cheap editions of valuable books. It is found that more than twice as many copies of any work will sell at 50 cents as will go at \$1.50 and the profits is greater on paper covers than on boards, so that the margin is saved. The result is that the public is getting the reading of good literature at one half to one third the cost to which it has formerly been put, as good literature is brought, within the reach of a very much greater number of people. So far it is good. But a book in paper covers cannot be preserved for long, and people who care more for books than to read them once will not feel that the best results of the cheapening process have been reached till the publishers have succeeded in making 50 cent books with board covers. Books in boards have felt the cheapening tendency already, and we may hope that the day is not far off when 50 cents to \$1 will be the range of prices of bound volmues of all books that are worthy of preservation. - Spring field Union.
