Mr. Stanley himself may be quoted in support of the theory that the Nile can be diverted from its course with comparatively little effort. In the course of conversation with Col. Colborne in Cairo on the eve of his departure for Zanzibar he described the Victoria Lake as lying on a plateau like an inverted basin. "It could be made to trickle over at any point," he exclaimed. The King of Uganda, he continued, might take it into his head any morning to turn off the Nile by ordering a thousand natives to drop stones across the Ripon Falls until they were blocked. As the channel is narrow, this could easily be done by such a force in nine months, and the population of Egypt would be starved. He did not suppose that King Mtesa would ever entertain such a project merely for the sake of creating trouble in the lower Nile countries, but considered it possible for him to block up the outlet of the lake in order to water tracts of land adjacent to it. The possession of Khartoum by the English, it is clear, would not prevent such a catastrophe as this. In order to secure Egypt against the loss of the fertilizing inundations, the whole course of the river from the junction of the Blue Nile to the sources of the White Nile would have to be controlled.
