The receipts of cotton at this port for the week ending yesterday foot up 4,900 bales, against 3,390 bales for the corresponding week of last year an increase this week of 1,510 bales. The receipts for the crop year to date foot up 113,585 bales, against 127,114 bales to same date last year, a decrease this year of 13,529 bales.
