Pork and Strawberries.
 Mr. J. W. Westbrook, of Harrison
 Creek, Pender county, was in the
 city to-day and from him we learn
 that there have been several severe
 frosts in his section of late. But lit-
 tle damage has been done however,
 except in a few instances where
 strawberry plants have been left
 uncovered and the blooms were
 blighted. Mr. Westbrook tells us
 that more or less meat has been lost
 by his neighbors. He himself killed
 about 3,000 pounds and of this he
 lost 300. The balance is still in pick-
 le and he expects to save it.

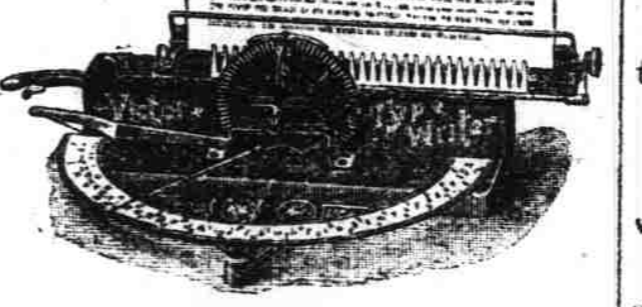
