STATE NEWS.

Charlotte News: In a window of the Racket store in Charlotte is displayed the door that belonged to the house in which President James K. Polk was born, in Pineville township, 11 miles from Charlotte.

—Mr. John E. Gallant, a farmer who lives in Steel Creek township, yesterday afternoon lost every house on his farm, save the well house, by fire. Fire broke out in his kitchen late in the afternoon, during the prevalence of the gale, and spread rapidly from one building to another. Mr. Gallant's residence, kitchen, barn and gin house were quickly swept away. Only the well house and one buggy from the barn. All that was saved from the residence was one bed and a sewing machine.

Winston Daily: Has been heavily laid upon a family, consisting of mother and son, living about two miles north of Winston.
