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

The Indiana State Democratic Convention to nominate candidates for State offices to be voted for at the November election will be held at Indianapolis, August 28, thus allowing but two months for the canvass. The Convention will be composed of 1,307 delegates. Chairman Jewett strongly favors a short campaign. He is highly pleased with

Democratic organization the throughout the State, which is far in advance of what it was at this time in 1888. New committees have been fully organized in eighty-one counties, and the other eleven will be reorganized by the first of July. Mr. Jewett predicts a sweeping Democratic victory in Indiana in November.

The Louisiana House of Delegates has passed a bill compelling rail roads operating in that State to provide on all their trains separate, though equal, accommodations for whites and negroes. Such a law has been for some time in force in Mississippi and in other Southern States, and has been declared constitutional by the United States Supreme Court. Since the adoption of this law in the neighboring State of Mississippi, there has been a growing demand for its adoption in Louisiana. The New Orleans Picayunc urges the passage of the bill by the Senate and its approval by the Governor as a move in the direction of much-need ed railroad reform in Louisiana. The Washington correspondent of the Springfield Republican says: "A bill to place Gen. Banks on the retired list with the rank of major Palmetto Railroad Co. general will probably be introduced in a few days in the Senate. Senator Butler, of South Carolina, who served in the Confederate army, has interested himself in the matter, and it has been suggested that it would be a graceful thing for his colleague, Gen. Wade Hampton, who is on the Committee on Military Affairs, to introduce the bill. The friends of Gen. Banks are becoming somewhat uneasy over the delay in the House Committee on Military Affairs and are disposed to push the matter in the Senate. 

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




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
