The statistics of lightning strokes in Germany during the past twenty six years have been investigated by Herr Kastner, who shows that the annual number of cases has more than doubled in that time. Last year there were no fewes than 1,145 strokes. They are most frequent in the hottest months of the year-June and July-and the hottest hours of the day of those following them-from 3 to 4 p. m. It appears that the thunder storms proceed from the hills, and the parts of their course most liable to be struck are woodless and flat pieces, valleys or rivers and low meadows near lakes, while wooded and hilly districts generally escape. This last deduction is hardly in accordance with popular ideas on the subject.
