The "fastest vessel afloat" is declared to be the 3,200-ton war ship built for the Argentine Republic by Armstrong, Mitchell & Co. Her name is the "20 de Mayo," the date of Argentine independence. Her biggest guns are two eight-inch guns, which, in developing 9,000-horse power, carried her through a six hours' trial at a speed of 21.37 knots. With forced draught that made 13,800-horse power she showed a speed of 22.43 knots.

Dr. Vickershafer, the Berlin analytical chemist, has invented a fluid for preserving purposes. The bodies of the late Emperor William and Empress Augusta were preserved by an injection of this liquid. Dr. Nickersheimer has now extended his experiments to the preservation of animals, and his experiments are said to have been very successful. The other day some innkeepers were invited by him to dinner, and he had a hare dished up which had been shot six weeks before and preserved by means of his fluid. The experts were all agreed that it was quite equal to fresh meat.

The official count gives Illinois to the Democrats on the State ticket by nearly 10,000 majority. This result has been kept in the background by the more general interest in the Senatorial contest, but it is hardly less important than the sweep of Michigan, Wisconsin and other old Republican States by the opposition. Illinois has never before been carried by the Democrats since the war. The nearest they ever came to it was in 1882, when the Republican candidate for Treasurer was elected by 5,484 plurality. Harrison carried the State by 22,195, Blaine by 24,827, Garfield by 40,716, and Grant in 1872, by 56,884. From 1868 down the Republican majorities have been of proportions like those, and in the corresponding election of 1886, when the candidate for Treasurer headed the ticket as now, the Republican plurality was 35,816. Even in the tidal wave year of 1874 the Republicans elected their candidate for Treasurer by 34,800 plurality. The vote of no State shows a more remarkable change than that of Illinois.

The London correspondent of the New York Sun says: "Sir Arthur Sullivan has completed the two casts for his grand opera, 'Ivanhoe,' which is to be produced at D'Oyly Carte's new theatre in January. Six of the principal roles will be filled by Americans. The two ladies who will play Lady Rowena are Misses Maude Palliser and Lucille Held, both American girls, and the two Templars are Eugene Audin and Francois Noije, and they, as well as Avon Saxon, one of the men chosen for Friar Tuck, and Richard Green, who will be Prince John, are likewise from the Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave. Actors who will assume the characters of Ivanhoe are Ben Davis and a young Irishman named Mara, a recent discovery of D'Oyly Carte, unknown to the stage. Mara is said to be a handsome young fellow with a powerful and magnificent voice. Rebecca will be played by Miss Tuddicombe and Margaret MacIntyre, and Richard the Lionhearted by Norman Salmond and Frank Clive. The four principal roles are those of Ivanhoe, Brian De Bois Guilbert, Rebecca and Rowena. Ivanhoe is a heavy bass part and the Templar a baritone, while Rebecca and Rowena are contrasted as dramatic and light soprano respectively. The two casts will not be kept entirely separate, as it is Sullivan's intention to have the members of the company to play interchangeably, so that the cast for each evening will only be announced on the morning of the day of the performance."
