Democratic Primaries.

NOTICE is hereby given to the Democratic voters of the County of WILMINGTON, Delaware, that the Democratic Primaries for the election of delegates to the State Convention of the Democratic Party, to be held at the City of Wilmington, Delaware, on Saturday, July 21, 1894, at 12 o'clock noon, shall be held at the following places, to-wit: In each ward, at the residence of the ward leader, or at such other place as may be designated by the Executive Committee of the ward or township, and in each township, at the residence of the township leader, or at such other place as may be designated by the Executive Committee of the township. The first ward is entitled to 18 delegates to the State Convention, the second ward to 17 delegates, the third ward to 16 delegates, the fourth ward to 15 delegates, the fifth ward to 14 delegates, the sixth ward to 13 delegates, the seventh ward to 12 delegates, the eighth ward to 11 delegates, the ninth ward to 10 delegates, the tenth ward to 9 delegates, the eleventh ward to 8 delegates, the twelfth ward to 7 delegates, the thirteenth ward to 6 delegates, the fourteenth ward to 5 delegates, the fifteenth ward to 4 delegates, the sixteenth ward to 3 delegates, the seventeenth ward to 2 delegates, and the eighteenth ward to 1 delegate.
