FOUL PLAY SUSPECTED.

The killing of Capt. Walter Chamberlain, the A. C. L. Conductor. A special to the Richmond, Va., Dispatch, from Petersburg, Va., in regard to the death of Capt. Walter Chamberlain, the A. C. L. Conductor (an account of which was given in yesterday's STAR) says the officers of the road in that city have some doubts regarding the theory of accident. The special says: "As soon as the train arrived at the depot in this city the accident was reported to Superintendent Sully, who, with other officers of the road, promptly went to the scene in a special train and made a thorough investigation as to the cause of the accident."

Death of Mr. T. F. McGill. Mr. T. F. McGill, a well known salesman of this city, died yesterday afternoon at his residence on Dock street, after an illness of two weeks with typhoid fever. He was about thirty-four years of age, and leaves a wife and two small children, who have the sympathy of many friends in this sad bereavement.

Accident to the Steamer Croatan. The Clyde steamer Croatan, Capt. Hansen, arrived here yesterday in a disabled condition, having broken her engine-shaft last Monday morning about twenty miles south of Cape Lookout. She was brought into Southport by the Clyde steamer Troquois, which fell in with the Croatan Tuesday. The Troquois was bound to New York, from Savannah, Ga. The damage to the Croatan's machinery will be speedily repaired, and will not interfere with her regular schedule.

The Raleigh News and Observer says: "Our Supreme Court, to avoid the necessity of counsel travelling on Sunday to attend that Court, have adopted a rule that hereafter no arguments will be heard on Mondays. To make up for the time so lost the number of hours devoted to hearing arguments on other days is increased. This will also have the advantage of requiring counsel to remain a shorter time in Raleigh before their cases are reached."
