

> [From a Star Correspondent.] FAYETTENILLE, N. C., Aug. 30th, 1882.

I happened to the good fortune vesterday to be present at the time when Col. Green, according to a short notice which was posted in Favetteville, was to address the Democrats of Cumberland. You are doubtless aware that the Superior Court of this county is now in session, holding a three weeks' term, and as an important case on the State docket was being tried, State vs. Leary, for assault with a deadly weapon, the audience at the outstart was not very large, but from the beginning of Col. Green's speech to its close the crowd gradually increased until several hundred had assembled. Col. Green commenced by saying if he was asked why his competitor was not here to meet him and have a joint discussion, he would reply that shortly after his own nomination his competitor had been invited to make arrangements for a joint discussion, but after waiting two weeks had at last returned an answer, to the effect that his private business and regard for the time of the people of the District would prevent his participating in one before October. But notwithstanding this consideration for the people's time we find Canaday last week in Harnett, and this week advertised to

speak in Fayetteville on the coming Saturday. The pretext is too thin to hold water- Two meetings take up double time, consequently Col. Green said he should henceforth ignore his competitor altogether in making out his appointments, and go ahead and fill them without regard to his convenience, will or pleasure. Continuing, he said his competitor had made himself so very merry and facetious over his (the Colonel's) oratorical powers, that he had looked forward to a joint dishad looked forward to a joint discussion with a degree of awe and apprehension, thinking that he (Canaday) must be a lineal descendant of Demosthenes or Cicero; and then Col. Green went on: But, gentlemen, I have met him, I have heard him, and the illusion is dispelled. Although laying but slight claim to oratory himself, nevertheless, he said, if he should, during the campaign, make as poor an effort as his opponent did at Lillington last Tuesday. nent did at Lillington last Tuesday, he would quit the field in mortificahe would quit the field in mortifica-tion and disgust; nay, more, if he had a fifteen-year old boy and the teacher should permit him to make such a spectacle of himself (and that, too, after the gentleman has so often canvassed for Congressional honors), he would feel like whipping the master and taking the boy from school. If three Congressional races have done so little in turning out a have done so little in turning out a public speaker, he would advise him to turn his attention to something else. Col. Green then took up the subject of public education, and for half an hour handled it in a most forcible and masterly way. He then arraigned the Republican party for its record of misrule, and showed the difference between Radical promisee and Democratic practice where the interests of the people and the State are involved. He depicted the danger, if, by any possibil-ity, the hungry leaders of the present amphibious party should come into power, of their saddling the State with payment of the special tax bonds. His review of the internal revenue system, which he termed the "abomination of abominations," was scathing indeed. There were a considerable number of good judges of a speech on the hustings present, and the verdict was that Col. Green made a speech of first-class merit both in matter and manner. We feel confident that those who hear him at other places in the District will be furnished with good and well digested Democratic doctrine. I am sorry that I cannot give you the speech in full, as I heard a learned, logical and judicious thinker say it


