BY THE GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAROLINA.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, for the protection of our people, as far as possible, against the evils of speculation, there are certain articles of our products beyond the limits of our State;

Now, therefore, I, ZEBULON B. VANCE, Governor of North Carolina, do issue this Proclamation, continuing in force the Proclamation of June 8th in force for thirty days from and after the 1st instant, in regard to Cotton and Woolen Cloth, Cotton and Woolen Yarns, Leather and Shoes, subject to such exceptions, &c., as have been expressed in my proclamations heretofore on the subject of exportation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Zebulun B. Vance, Governor of North Carolina, has signed these presents and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed, this 10th day of July, A. D. 1863, and in the year of American Independence the 87th.

GENERAL ORDER,
No. 13.

THE COMMANDING OFFICERS OF THE MILITIA are ordered to enroll all able bodied white men between the ages of forty and fifty five years, who are not enrolled under this order.

In addition to the exemptions under said act, heretofore published, are the following exempted under the act of the Congress and approved April 30th, 1863: Justices of the Peace, County Trustees, County Solicitors, Coroners, Registers, Tax Collectors, one Deputy Sheriff in each County where there is no Tax Collector, Constables and Police of Raleigh, Wilmington, Fayetteville, Salisbury and Charlotte, Clerks of the Superior Court of each County for distributing money and provisions among soldiers' families, Agents appointed under act of Legislature for any public duty, Militia Officers, Mayor and Police of Raleigh, Wilmington, Fayetteville, Salisbury and Charlotte, Clerks of the State, Board of Internal Improvement, Literary Board, and Employees of the State Government in the different departments.

THE Commanding Officers of the Militia will report with the men ordered to be enrolled, at Raleigh, on or before the 1st of August.

GENERAL ORDER,
No. 15.

IN COMPLIANCE WITH AN ACT OF THE RE- cent Legislature, Commanding Officers of the Militia are ordered to enroll all white persons not already enrolled in the service of the Confederate States, between the ages of 18 and 50 years, including foreigners not naturalized who have been residents of the State for thirty days before said enrollment.

There shall be exempt from the operations of this order the Governor, the Judges of the Supreme and Superior Courts of Law and Equity, Members of the General Assembly, the Officers of the several Departments of the Government, Members of Congress, Civil and Military Officers of the Confederate Government in the State, the Ministers of the Gospel of the several Religious Denominations of the State, charged with the duties of such ministry, the high Sheriff and Clerks of the several Courts of Record, and the Public Registers in the several counties.

Officers of the Militia will be enrolled for Home Defense, and their Commissions, when called into service will be suspended only during the period of such service.

This order is not intended to interfere with the enrollment for immediate service, those between the ages of 40 and 45 years under Order No. 13.
