OUR Gallant Defenders.—The Charleston Courier, says, "We return thanks to a gallant officer in Fort Sumter, November 27, 1863.—The heroism of Sergeant Jasper of Revolutionary fame has been at times equalled, if not surpassed by some of the defenders of this grim and ruined fortress. This morning the flag staff which is now just high enough to flaunt our colors in the eyes of the foe, was cut away by a Parrot shot, but no sooner had it fallen than four gallant young soldiers sprang to the parapet and replaced it. They were exposed to a severe fire while thus engaged, as they were obliged to splice the pieces of the staff together and make a hole for its reception, and these operations necessarily occupied some time. The enemy perceived them, and opened upon them with 300 pounder Parrots; at one time the very flag was swept by a shot from their hands, but with undimmed courage they continued their heroic work to its noble consummation. When the staff was securely planted and the starry cross appeared in its folds to the morning breeze, they gathered beneath its shadow and gave three rousing cheers. Their names were Corporals W. C. Buckmaster and A. J. Blunt, and Privates C. B. Foster and Jas. Tupper, Jr., "Charleston Battalion."

Georgia.—No Speculation in Augusta.—The city authorities of Augusta have prohibited the purchase within that city of any article of produce for speculation. No man is to be permitted to buy any article of the kind and sell it at any time for more than he paid for it. To enforce the observance of this ordinance, a detective has been appointed, with plenary power to prevent or report violations of the ordinance.

A Remarkable Girl.—They have at one of the numerous exhibitions in New York "the tallest girl in the world," of which a paper says: "This is a young lady of seventeen years of age who has reached the amazing height of eight feet one inch, and is still growing. The giant boy, who is now at Barnum's, is eight feet high, the girl surpassing him by an inch; but as the height of the latter averages a much smaller figure than that of man, the contrast presented in the case of the girl is still more marvellous. Her face, her arms, her fingers, her feet, are in proper proportion to her great height—tremendous in size and length. Her foot is fifteen inches long, and its width exceeds the length of many a lady's dainty pedestal. The fingers are huge. An ordinary arm by the side of this lady's looks puny and stunted. Her knee reaches nearly to the hip of a person of ordinary height. She is agreeable and pleasant in manner, quite handsome for her size, and well proportioned. A lady of usual height standing beside her seems the veriest infant. The sensation of a person on seeing this lady rise to her feet is one of positive fright. To watch her onward progress with raised eyes is appalling to a person unprepared for the sight. To use the expression of a little girl who saw her rising from her chair, "Why she keeps going up." A lady of five feet six—an lady of that height is considered quite tall—walks under her arm without stooping. Her weight, considering her size, is not remarkable, being three hundred and seventy-nine pounds. The gait of her dress are being rapidly made to be ready if possible for her appearance on Monday. They take twenty-two yards of cloth. All her clothes, of course, have to be made for her by special measure, and very large measure. Her young lady's mother is in the city. She is a small, slightly built lady, with an infant, the brother of the giantess, which any man on dangle at the ends of his fingers. The infant will have to grow amazingly fast to reach his sister's proportions.
