Rain in North Carolina .- It has been found by careful observation by aid of pluviometers that the average annual fall of rain in this State is about 45 inches perpendicular, in other words, would cover the State with water about 45 inches deep. From an eighth to a quarter of an inch would make a moderate "April shower," one half to three quarters of an inch, a good farming "sea-son." An inch deep would be a heavy rain. Ia June 1861 fell the heaviest rain on record in this State, seven and a half inches. The heaviest rain ever observed was in Guinea-twenty one inches .- Raleigh Conservative.
