Extract of an act of the General Allemniy of Maryland "concerning the Territory of Columbia and

BE it enacted. That any foreigner may by deed or will hereafter to be made, take and hold lands in that part of the faid territory, which lies within this state, in the same manner as if he was a citizen of this state; and the same lands may be conveyed aby him and transmitted to and be amberited by his heirs or relations, as if he and they were citizens of this state: Provided that no foreigner shall in virtue thereof be entitled to any further or other priviledge of a citizen.

WHEREAS William Hill, Efquire, Attorney for the United States, in and for the state of North-Carolina district, this feventh day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, and of American Independence the seventeenth, exhibited his two several libels before the Honourable John Sitgreaves, Esquire, Judge of the district court of the United States in the North-Carolina district; one of which faid libels is against two hundred and twenty fix dozen and nine bottles of porter, of manufacture foreign to the United States, contained in feventy fix calks or packages, each calk or package containing a less quantity than six dozen bottles, for having been imported into Wilmington diftrict on the nineteenth day of J nuary last past, by Thomas Farrell matter of the Smp Ann, last from Liverpool in the kingdom of Great-Britain, contrary to the act of the Congress of the United States in such case provided. The faid two hundred and twenty fix dozen and nine bottles of porter, being then and there found to imported contrary to the act of the Congress of the United States as aforetaid, by James Read, Elquire, Collector of the port of Wilmington; were then and there leized and fecured.
